Walking in God's Law

The 6th Commandment

Before opening God's word, say prayer asking God for the Holy Spirit to guide you and to bless you with understanding in the Name of our Blessed Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Pray for the blessing of remembrance of His Word in a time of need and that you may meditate upon them throughout your days in the Name of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

Thou shalt not kill. Exodus 20:13 and Deuteronomy 5:17.

Meaning of the word kill

A primitive root; properly to *dash* in pieces, that is, *kill* (a human being), **especially to murder**: - **put to death**, kill, (man-) slay (-er), murder (-er).

(References from the Strong's Concordance)

Whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed: for in the image of God made he man. Genesis 9:6 [See Genesis 1:26-27](#). "But if thou wilt enter into life, keep the commandments. He saith unto him, Which? Jesus said, **Thou shalt do no murder**, Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Honour thy father and thy mother: and, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. " [Matthew 19:17-19](#).

To kill is to end a life, to cause death. "Thou shall not kill" does not mean that we can't defend ourselves. If the death of our attacker is the only way of escape and save yourself, or perhaps our family, that is the course we need to take. Nor are we a murderer if we accidentally kill someone, or in time of war, in the laws of war.

Yet there are times and events that cause death, and it is to a greater degree, premeditated, although not towards any person or individual. Take a drunk driver, or someone on drugs for instance; if they get into a car and drive, it is their responsibility, in their hands, to what happens if someone is killed. They made the choice to drink or use drugs, then drive, knowing how the effect of these substances changes their ability to do things safely. When they were sober, they made the choice to take these substances with a clear mind. Then they must accept the responsibility for what they do after that as well. It is not an accident, but murder. Because they selfishly believe they are in control and can drive, they just disobey the laws. They tend to trust themselves, although they are under the influence of these substances. They may have been under the influence throughout their life and got away with driving in that condition, so they believe they are above the laws and continue to drive. They may even believe they know better, or they just don't care, as they come first, in the here and now needs, with no thought or care for others.

Now, if you have a car accident, because you just hit a pothole on the road, and the tire blows, causing the car to cross over into the other side of the road killing the driver of the car coming the other way. You have no control over these kinds of accidents. If you take good care of your car mechanically and always make sure your tires are in good order and don't speed and drive safely including pulling over when tired, not using your mobile phone, it is out of your hands to what may happen in these kinds of situations. If you make a conscience decision not to look after your car for whatever reason, then it can be put onto you for any death resulting in an accident caused by the car due to mechanical failure that could have been avoided if you took good care of your car. However, things can go wrong even though you look after your car, this is an accident it's out of your hands.

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God's Word works in all aspects of our lives. We must understand that there are many things in life that we need to consider when making decisions. That's why we need to ask of God for guidance and His will and wisdom in our lives. Then we need to surrender ourselves and will, to God. "And thine ears shall hear a word behind thee, saying, This is the way, walk ye in it, when ye turn to the right hand, and when ye turn to the left." Isaiah 30:21.

"Thou shalt not kill" does not mean that we are not to kill animals in a time when it is in need to do so. Animals are not made in the image of God. "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them." Genesis 1:27. "Whoso sheddeth man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed: for in the image of God made he man." Genesis 9:6. Animals are not temples of God where the Holy Spirit dwells in their hearts, like people. "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you? If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy; for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are." 1 Corinthians 3:16-17. However, we are not to kill an animal without a good reason. Killing clean animals for food, or killing any creatures for controlling numbers or pests, killing animals to protect others, or ourselves, from danger, or death, these are good reasons. However, killing for sport, or the fun of it, is not.

Look up and read Exodus 21:12-15; Numbers 35:9-34; Deuteronomy 19:1-6. You will see that the Lord knows that murder is murder, and an accident is an accident, defending is defending.

If a thief be found breaking up, and be smitten that he die, there shall no blood be shed for him. Exodus 22:2.

And this know, that if the goodman of the house had known what hour the thief would come, he would have watched, and not have suffered his house to be broken through. Luke 12:39.

The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: John 10:10.

"Thou shalt not kill". Exodus 20:13.

Is there more to this Commandment then killing someone, if so, what is it?

Look up and read Matthew 5:21-22; 1 John 2:9-11; 3:15-24; 4:20-21. Then answer the question above.

Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath: Neither give place to the devil. Ephesians 4:26-27. Hate should be given to God. If you feel any bad ill towards anyone, please pray and talk to God about it. Give all these feelings of ill, envy, hatred, to God. Pray for those that you have these feelings towards, and yourself. Ask for forgiveness. "Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved." Psalms 55:22. "But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; That ye may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: ..." Matthew 5:44-45a.

"Thou shalt not kill." {PP 308.4}

All acts of injustice that tend to shorten life; the spirit of hatred and revenge, or the indulgence of any passion that leads to injurious acts toward others, or causes us even to wish them harm (for "whosoever hateth his brother is a murderer"); a selfish neglect of caring for the needy or

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suffering; all self-indulgence or unnecessary deprivation or excessive labor that tends to injure health--all these are, to a greater or less degree, violations of the sixth commandment. {PP 308.5} EGW

Remember to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in Jesus name each time you study God's word. At the start and end of your study, pray.

Please read Ecclesiastes 3:1-15.

Loving your enemies does not mean you let them kill you and your family. Self-defense is not vengeance, nor is it, like vengeance, premeditated. Self-defense is something you do to stop your attacker from killing you or your loved ones. However, if there is a reason you may feel like you should revenge yourself, please do not take that path; otherwise, you end up taking a place that does not belong to us, because vengeance belongs to God. The Holy scriptures says, "Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord." Romans 12:19. However, self-defense is not vengeance. And vengeance is not allowing the law to take place for the crime someone committed. The criminal being arrested for the crimes they commit is punishment, that is the law of the land, and it is also under the laws of God. The law may take the criminal through the courts. Although the courts can be used for vengeance, As God fearing children of God, we should never use the courts for vengeance. To help us know and have a clear understanding, we should pray and ask of God for wisdom. It is the wisdom in the scriptures, guided by the Spirit of God, through Christ Jesus, that gives us clear understanding of the Word of God that helps us discern the difference of right and wrong, while walking in the Will of God.

Self-defense

(law) the right to defend one's person, family, or property against attack or threat of attack by the use of no more force than is reasonable.

We need not to live in fear, for Jesus said, "fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him (God) which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." Matthew 10:28.

And I say unto you my friends, Be not afraid of them that kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do. But I will forewarn you whom ye

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shall fear: Fear him (God), which after he hath killed hath power to cast into hell; yea, I say unto you, Fear him. [Luke 12:4-5](#).

Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved. [Psalms 55:22](#).

Hide thy face from my sins, and blot out all mine iniquities. Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me. There are many wars in the Bible and many people died. But is killing in time of war linked to “Thou shall not kill”?

War is not a beautiful thing; it is extremely violent and ugly. However, most times it is of necessity to go to war, even when you yourself don't want to. War, in a lot of ways is self-defense form other parties that tries to control, takeover, have their way, in an unjust way. Think of the Second World War, if our country did not fight because of the “Thou shall not kill” commandment, we today would be under the rule of evil dictators who believe that they were more superior to any other people or race and anyone that was not of their superiority was to be killed and wiped out. This was also for those that did not fit the bill in their own race.

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Ecclesiastes 3:1-15 tells us that there is “A time to kill” “A time to cast away stones” “a time of war”. Read all of Ecclesiastes 3:1-15 again.

The Commandment “Thou shall not kill” is regarding murder. Premeditated acts of murder, whether for revenge, or in the doing of an evil act, even in times of war when killings become murder when done outside the laws of war. Yes, even in time of war there are laws each side should abide by. If anyone that breaks the laws of war are then prosecuted for war crimes. War is all through the scriptures and murder is too, we need to understand when the time to kill is or we will be killed and those that have come upon us will be living and you will not be, nor your children or family.

Look up and read 1 Samuel chapter 17, then answer the following questions.

Was this “a time to kill” or should the Israelites have let the Philistines take them captive or kill them?

Did you notice that God was with the Israelites?

God said “For I am the LORD, I change not;” Malachi 3:6. “My covenant will I not break, nor alter the thing that is gone out of my lips. Psalms 89:34. Also see Hebrews 13:8.

These six things doth the LORD hate: yea, seven are an abomination unto him: A proud look, a lying tongue, **and hands that shed innocent blood**, An heart that deviseth wicked imaginations, feet that be swift in running to

mischievous, A false witness that speaketh lies, and he that soweth discord among brethren. Proverbs 6:16-19.

Clearly there is a time for war, a time to kill, a time to defend; therefore, don’t allow defending yourself or others to be lost in the misunderstanding with The Commandment “Thou shall not kill”. Yet, never allow oneself to be found as a murderer, guilty of evil, nor involved in any crime, breaking the laws of God or the laws of the land.

Killing someone spiritually.

Read Deuteronomy 13:3-11 and answer the following.

How serious is the act of trying to take someone spiritually away from God? With the children of Israel, if someone tried to take any of them away from God, to serve other gods, where they to let it happen?

Back then God laid the punishment down to keep order in the fear/reverence to Him. For us today we have His Word to keep order in the fear/reverence of God. “But continue thou in the things which thou hast learned and hast been assured of, knowing of whom thou hast learned them; And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus. All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works.” 2 Timothy 3:14-17. “Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.” Romans 12:19. “And I say unto you my friends, Be not afraid of them that kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do. But I will forewarn you whom ye shall fear: Fear him (God), which after he hath killed hath power to cast into hell; yea, I say unto you, Fear him.” Luke 12:4-5.

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Fear

to frighten, that is, (passively) to be alarmed; by analogy to be in awe of, that is, revere: - be (+ sore) afraid, fear (exceedingly), reverence.

Think of those people around you who see what you do and hear what you say. If we do what we have just read in 1 Corinthians 6:1-8 and in James 4:1

and 11, how could we be killing someone spiritually who witness these things?

Also note 1 Timothy 6:4-10, Titus 3:3.

We may not think about it that deeply, however our hearts may kill the hearts of others spiritually who are around us, seeing our choices in a supposedly relationship with God. We say we love God, yet our hearts may be witnessing something completely different to those around us. This is why it is so important to give all to the LORD our God in prayer. Asking God for Jesus, our author and finisher of our faith, to work within our hearts that we may be a witness for Him, to those around us. Note Hebrews 5:9 and 12:2.

Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath: For the wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God. James 1:19-20.

Let not mercy and truth forsake thee: bind them about thy neck; write them upon the table of thine heart: So shalt thou find favour and good understanding in the sight of God and man. Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths. Be not wise in thine own eyes: fear the LORD, and depart from evil. It shall be health to thy navel, and marrow to thy bones. Proverbs 3:3-8.

Rejoice in the Lord always: and again I say, Rejoice. Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand. Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all
